Private Sector meets H.E the President over power tariffs

PSFU; who are we?

The private sector met with H.E the President of Uganda Yoweri Kaguta Museveni on the 26th October 2006 in State House Nakasero. The meeting was organized to discuss power tariff as well as incentives for the private sector in Uganda. A number of resolutions were affirmed at the meeting including;

1. Government and the private sector agreed to cooperate and share the burden of the tariff increase.
2. The private sector agreed to share Shs 114 billion out of the required Shs 268 billion.
3. That the private sector would be able to benefit from fiscal incentives in order to mitigate the shock at least in the short to medium term.

Some of the incentives were cross boundary, while others were local and could be executed by the Uganda government immediately.

These included;

1. A 100% depreciation of new equipment (e.g generator sets and inverters) in the first year of acquisition. This was agreed by the Minister of Finance.
2. The Ministry of Finance also agreed to provide some local incentives for the private sector to generate and sell power to the Grid.

The other incentive proposed but which required consultation with other EA partners was

- a) An upward/downward review of import duty (depending on the sector) to allow for adjustment within the local manufacturing industry (Government protection). The Ministry of Finance agreed to this and promised to make a case for the Uganda manufacturing industry at the EAC.
